33 TRUCKERS WILL COMPETE IN DOUBLE NICKEL CHALLENGE


Thirty-three big-rig truck operators from 20 states will challenge the U.S. Department of Transportation in a fuel economy competition at the Transportation

Research Center, East Liberty, Ohio, on August 1, 2 and 3.

The competition, billed as the "Double Nickel Challenge", is being conducted jointly by the Department's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and the 200-member Voluntary Truck and Bus Fuel Economy Improvement Program as a demonstration of comparative fuel efficiencies.

DOT hopes to prove the validity of its claim that 18-wheelers operate far more efficiently at 55 mph, the national maximum speed limit, than at higher speeds. Challenging that claim is the owner-operator segment of the trucking industry which has contested the national 55 mph speed limit's fuel-saving value.

Eleven trucks representing various makes, models, engines and transmissions, will run each of the three days beginning on August 1 at 7:00 a.m. Starting times will be staggered and the last truck should complete its run at 4:00 p.m. daily

What are archives? How are archives different from libraries?

An archives is an organization that collects, preserves, and provides access to records. The term archives can also refer to the records themselves. Like libraries, we organize information and strive to meet the information needs of researchers. Unlike libraries, we focus primarily on historical preservation, collecting more unpublished materials and ephemera.

I'm looking for . Should I search ArchivesSpace or ROSA P?

Search ROSA P for more recent publications, born-digital materials, technical reports, datasets, and other research-oriented resources. Search ArchivesSpace for historical and unpublished materials.

While all the NTL Archives' digital objects can be found on ROSA P, we recommend beginning your search for digitized archival materials in ArchivesSpace because it accommodates the multi-level nature of archival description. After locating a record in ArchivesSpace, you can follow the link in the finding aid to view the digital object on ROSA P.



How to Search

When entering a search term in ArchivesSpace, you can use the "Search field" dropdown menu to indicate where in the finding aid you would like that term to appear. There are six options:



- Keyword searches the entire finding aid.
- **Title** searches the title of archival units at all levels: collections, series, folders, and items.
- **Creator** searches the creator field at the collection level only, not at the file or item level. For example, if there is one speech by Undersecretary Beggs in a collection of speeches by Secretary Volpe, a creator search for Beggs would not return that speech. In this situation, searching for Beggs in the title field is recommended.
- Subject searches a finding aid's assigned topic, location, and genre/form tags.
- Notes searches all of the notes in a finding aid, which typically include scope and contents, historical/biographical, access and use, and language, among others.
- Identifier searches the unique string of characters assigned to each collection.

ArchivesSpace allows you to further refine your search by limiting the results to a certain record type and date range. There are three record type options:
